Key Funding Priorities for Long-Term Sustainability



Securing our Future Water Supply:

- Complete design of Advanced Water **Purification Facility**
- Land acquisition for importation pipeline from Dell City
- Additional wells
- Desalination expansion Phase 1



System expansion for city growth:

- Water/wastewater pipeline extensions (east, northeast)
- New water storage tanks, pump stations



Improvements in Customer Services:

- Start implementation of a new Customer Information System
- (voice, text, e-mail, chat)
- Start construction of a new modern call center



Rehabilitation of Aging Infrastructure:

- Major wastewater plant upgrades at **Bustamante and Hickerson Plants**
- Water/wastewater pipeline replacements
- Canal Water Treatment Plant upgrades
- New modern Field Office









